

As a disciple of St. John, the Evangelist, St. Polycarp was able to hear about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection directly from those who witnessed it. Because Polycarp was ordained as Bishop of Smyrna by St. John, he is one of three chief Apostolic Fathers, along with Clement of Rome and Ignatius of Antioch.

During his life Polycarp defended the Church against heresies. His important writing, the *Letter to the Philippians*, quoted the Gospels and Acts of the Apostles, stressing Paul's authority in the Church and setting out clear arguments against the gnostic heresy that denied Christ's divinity.

The early period of the Church was a dangerous time to be a Christian and like many, St. Polycarp was martyred. He was captured by Romans and sentenced to burn at the stake. However, the fire did not touch him, instead rising up like sails around him. Seeing that the flames would not injure Polycarp, the Romans stabbed him instead. The Martyrdom of Polycarp is perhaps the earliest fully preserved account of a Christian martyr.

Note from the Pastor:

The following is taken from the Thursday, January 25, 2024 edition of *The Catholic Accent* (Vol. 63, No. 5, Pg. 26):

After consultation with the Diocesan Priest Council, Bishop Larry J. Kulick is restoring the option for the faithful to receive holy Communion under both species on the first weekend of Lent, Feb. 17-18. Monsignor Raymond E. Riffle, Diocesan Vicar General and Rector at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, Greensburg, made the announcement to priests in the Diocese to allow them to take any actions needed to restore this practice in their parishes. "Although the option for reception of the Precious Blood is being restored, it is not required that every parish implement this action," Monsignor Riffle said. "This practice is to be instituted at the discretion of the pastor or administrator on a parish-by-parish basis."

With this announcement in mind and after prayerful consideration of our own circumstances, I have decided that for the parishes of Christ the King and Saint Gertrude, we will not be restoring holy Communion under both species *at this time*. The primary concern right now for our parishes is not having an adequate number of extraordinary ministers of holy Communion. I am certainly open to revisit and reevaluate this decision in the future. As we are in the midst of a National Eucharistic Revival, we are all reminded that when we receive holy Communion, even if only under one species, we still receive the fullness of Christ. And, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us, "[b]efore so great a sacrament, the faithful can only echo humbly and with ardent faith the words of the Centurion: 'Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul will be healed' (1386)."

May God continue to bless you and may each of us have a spiritually fruitful Lenten journey.



PRAYER THIS LENTEN SEASON

Every family and household is encouraged to take a renewed look at the penitential practice of prayer this Lenten Season.

If families gathered together once each day for prayer, we will have begun to deepen our understanding of our baptismal promises, and will be more prepared to "renew" these promises at an Easter liturgy. There are many other creative ways to build a "habit of prayer" throughout Lent that can continue "forever and ever Amen!" Other suggestions:

- * Attend at least one daily Mass for each week of Lent.
- * Find out when and where Adoration of the Holy Eucharist is offered or stop by a church. Spend time in prayer before Our Lord in the Tabernacle.
- * Begin the practice of offering thanks before every meal.
- * Help a refugee family get settled. Pray for peace in war-torn regions.
- * Work together in a soup kitchen and converse with persons served.
- * Write a letter of faith and encouragement to some who is incarcerated.
- * Visit an elderly or sick person. Take care of an errand for them.
- * Be an advocate. Write to an elected official and/or donate to a cause that provides resources to meet the needs of poor and low-income people in your community or in a troubled part of the world.
- * Once a week eat meals that total no more than the daily cost allotted by government food assistance programs for your size family. (See USDA Modified Thrifty Food Plan).
