

Staying Connected During COVID-19

I have been keeping the parishioners of Christ the King in my prayers during this pandemic. I can't even imagine the difficulties you must be facing; balancing family, job, school and everything else that has been made more complicated by COVID-19. During this stress-filled time, I want you to know that our parish continues to care for the spiritual and material needs of our faith community.

Once our church building was closed in March, I was able to attend to members of the parish via the telephone, as I was able, and minister to the pastoral needs of the critically ill. Once the church was opened, I was able to conduct funerals. Katie Tylinski, our Regional Formation Director, and Jim Peterman were able to prepare the children of the parish to receive the sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation. Due to COVID-19 gathering restrictions, they instituted and aided the parents of the children receiving those sacraments in a successful homeschooling program. I was able to administer those sacraments to the children this past summer.

Katie also created and introduced a wonderful virtual Vacation Bible School in which the parish children could participate online. Additionally, our cleaning volunteers sanitized the church and restrooms after each use.

COVID-19 and its Impact on our Faith Community

Our parish offertory remained strong primarily due to the generosity of our parishioners, but was greatly assisted by online giving and a record-breaking Diocesan Lenten Appeal. The parish income was greatly assisted by an infusion of funds from the Paycheck Protection Program, offered by the government.

Our parish, however, suffered greatly from the loss of fundraising income. All of our fundraising activities, including our Thanksgiving/Christmas bake sale, were cancelled. To help recover some lost income for the parish, the staff initiated a "socially distant" Fall Lottery for September and October, and members of our Easter bake sale committee are hoping they can resume baking next spring.

Capital Improvements

Your contributions to our parish help to maintain the facility, making it the center of prayer in our community. Over the last three years, we filled cracks, sealed and repaired the parish parking lot; created a safety barrier around the gas meter adjacent to the lot; and made repairs to the sidewalk curb. We installed a roll-up window in the pass-through area of the hall kitchen. We repaired the roof on the office side of the parish hall and made safety improvements to the parish picnic grounds by removing old booths and repairing the restrooms.

We installed, through the generosity of a parishioner, a beautiful new "Christ the King" stained glass window in the church. Additionally, at St. Catherine Cemetery, we purchased a used dump truck and completed the road paving project that was started several years ago.

Religious Formation Leaders and Youth Ministry Leaders

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

Parishioners assist the priest in distributing the Eucharist at Mass.

Women's Guild

The Women's Guild provides many social, spiritual and service opportunities for parish women.

Greeters

Greeters welcome Parishioners to our faith community.

Lectors

Lectors proclaim the word of God during Mass or at other liturgical functions. Lectors devote time to preparation and understanding of sacred Scripture.

Ministry of Consolation/Funeral Luncheon Ministers

These important positions help ease the burden of those suffering from loss of a family member or friend.

Ushers

The ushers take up the offertory and distribute bulletins after Mass. They also assist as needed with emergencies and other concerns.

Fundraising volunteers

The many fundraisers at the parish — bake sales, pierogi sale, Halloween party, bingo, rummage sale and special dinners — simply could not happen without the help of our dedicated volunteers.

Raffle ticket volunteers

Assisting with an important fundraising opportunity, the volunteers help raise money for our church community.

Ministry of Care

These volunteers provide pastoral care to the sick and homebound of the parish. The ministers take the Eucharist to the sick where they are — at home, a personal care home or a nursing home.
